## Chapter 10

<sup>1</sup>From there Jesus set out and came into the regions of Judea and those beyond the Jordan. Crowds again gathered to him, and he was teaching them as usual. <sup>2</sup>Then pharisees approached and were questioning him, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce a woman?" They did this to test him.

<sup>3</sup>But he answered them, "What did Moses command you to do?"

<sup>4</sup>They answered, "Moses allowed a written certificate for divorce."

<sup>5</sup>But Jesus answered them, "It was because of your hard hearts that he wrote this commandment for you. <sup>6</sup>But from the beginning of Creation God made them male and female. <sup>7</sup>For this reason, a man will leave his father and mother <sup>8</sup>and the two will become one flesh. So, they are no longer two but one flesh. <sup>9</sup>Therefore, let no one divide what God has united."

<sup>10</sup>When they were again in a home, the disciples questioned him about this. <sup>11</sup>He told them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another woman commits adultery against his ex-wife. <sup>12</sup>And if a wife divorces her husband and marries another man, she commits adultery."

<sup>13</sup>Parents were bringing children to Jesus so that he might touch them, but the disciples scolded them. <sup>14</sup>Jesus was indignant when he saw this happening and said to them, "Allow the children to come to me. Do not hinder them. For the Kingdom of God is made up of people like these children. <sup>15</sup>I tell you beyond a doubt that whoever does not receive the Kingdom of God as a child receives it, will never enter it." <sup>16</sup>Then he took them into his arms and was blessing them as he laid his hands on them.

<sup>17</sup>As he was setting out on the journey, a man ran up to him, knelt down, and questioned him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

<sup>18</sup>But Jesus replied, "Why do you say I am good? No one is good except one - God. <sup>19</sup>You know the commandments: Do not murder, do not commit adultery, do not steal, do not give a false testimony, do not defraud, honor your father and mother."

<sup>20</sup>But the man replied, "Teacher, I have been careful to obey all these commandments from my youth."

<sup>21</sup>After considering what he said, Jesus felt a love for him and said, "You lack one thing. Go. Sell whatever you have and give it to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come and follow me."

<sup>22</sup>But the man was shocked by this statement and went away sorrowful, for he owned much property.

<sup>23</sup>Jesus looked around and then spoke to his disciples, "It is very difficult for those with

wealth to enter the Kingdom of God."

<sup>24</sup>The disciples were amazed by what he said, but Jesus again responded, "Children, how difficult it is to enter the Kingdom of God. <sup>25</sup>It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the Kingdom of God."

<sup>26</sup>But they were even more shocked and said to themselves, "Then who can be saved?"

<sup>27</sup>Looking at them, Jesus said, "With men – impossible! But not with God. All things are possible with God."

<sup>28</sup>Peter began to say to him, "Look, we left everything to follow you."

<sup>29</sup>Jesus said, "Know this with certainty, no one who has left behind a house, or brothers, or sisters, or a mother, or a father, or children, or fields because of me and the Good News <sup>30</sup>will fail to receive in this present time a hundred times as many houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and fields, along with persecutions. And in the coming age, eternal life. <sup>31</sup>But, many who are first will be last, and many who are last will be first."

<sup>32</sup>Now they were on the way up to Jerusalem. Jesus was leading the way, and they were amazed, but others who followed were afraid. He again took the Twelve aside and was telling them about the things that were about to happen to him. <sup>33</sup>"Pay attention! We are going up to Jerusalem and the Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and scribes. They will condemn him to death and hand him over to the Gentiles. <sup>34</sup>And they will mock him, and spit on him, and scourge him and kill him. Yet after three days he will rise up."

<sup>35</sup>Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached him and said, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask you."

<sup>36</sup>He said to them, "What do you want me to do for you?"

<sup>37</sup>They replied, "Allow one of us to sit on your right side and one of us to sit on your left side in your glory."

<sup>38</sup>But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink? Are you able to be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with?"

<sup>39</sup>They replied, "We are able."

Jesus said to them, "You will drink the cup that I drink and be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with. <sup>40</sup>But, to sit on my right or on my left is not mine to grant. They are for those for whom they have been prepared."

<sup>41</sup>When the ten other disciples heard this, they were resentful of James and John. <sup>42</sup>So, Jesus summoned them and said to them, "You know that those who are considered rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and those in high positions wield power over them. <sup>43</sup>But

it is not like this among you. Rather, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant. <sup>44</sup>And whoever wants to be first among you must be a slave of all. <sup>45</sup>For even the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and give his life as a ransom for many."

<sup>46</sup>Then they came to Jericho. As Jesus was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a great crowd, a blind beggar named Bartimaeus (son of Timaeus) was sitting by the road. <sup>47</sup>When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth he began to cry out, "Son of David, Jesus, have mercy on me!" <sup>48</sup>Many were rebuking him to be quiet. But he kept crying out even more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!"

So, they called the blind man, saying, "Take heart. Get up. He is calling you." <sup>50</sup>So, he threw off his coat, spang up, and came to Jesus.

<sup>51</sup>Jesus asked him, "What do you want me to do for you?"

The blind man said to him, "Rabbi, I want to see."

<sup>52</sup>Jesus replied, "Depart. Your faith has healed you."

Instantly he could see, and he followed Jesus on the way."
