Practice writing each letter by tracing over the grey outlines and then writing additional copies of the letter to fill the line. For some letters, a star (★) marks the starting point and arrows show the direction of the strokes. As you write each letter, say its name aloud. Make additional copies of this sheet if you need more practice.

<b>Upper-Case Phi</b> : Draw a circle and then draw a vertical line through the middle. The vertical line should not go above the top line or below the base line, but it does go slightly above and below the circle.

<b>Lower-Case Phi:</b> There are two common ways to write the lower-case Phi. For the first way, begin at the star and write the letter in one continuous stroke without lifting your pen. For the second way, draw a circle and then
draw a vertical line through the middle. Note that for both ways the vertical line goes below the base line.

Upper-Case Chi: Write it as you would an English upper-case X (but it sounds like the ch in loch).

<b>Lower-Case Chi</b> : Write it as you would an English lower-case x (but it sounds like the <b>ch</b> in lo <b>ch</b> ). Note that the
bottom of the Chi goes below the base line.

Upper-Case Psi: Draw a u shape and then draw a vertical line through the middle.

<b>Lower-Case Psi</b> : The lower-case Psi is a smaller version of the upper-case Psi. Note that the bottom of the vertical line goes below the base line.
